

The following updates to EMIS, MCMIS, and SAFETYNET were released on Saturday, November 1, 2008.

The following changes were implemented in EMIS.

- Updates to SANDOG letters (with the exception of SA letters) were completed.
- Safety Investigator (SI) codes containing alphanumeric data will now be accepted.
- New household goods violations were added.

The following changes were implemented in MCMIS.

- Changes to the existing UNSAT letters for 45 and 60 day notices were implemented.
- The calculation used for Percent of OOS Inspections for the total years in the Company Safety Profile (CSP) Report was corrected.

The following changes were implemented in SAFETYNET.

- Selecting or updating the Agency Name on Level VII inspections now displays the selected Agency name adjacent to the button.
- Minor programming bugs related to Aspen Inspections with violation 391.11B2S being rejected and a problem with the Special Study Fields were corrected.

Beginning on Monday, November 3, 2008, a script will be placed in each SAFETYNET mailbox, which will cause inspections that were uploaded between September 26, 2008 and October 6, 2008 and that contain "special study fields" data to be uploaded again. This is to ensure data completeness due to a MCMIS error which has been resolved.

The following updates to Query Central, CAPRI, CaseRite, and UFA were released in October.

The following changes were implemented in Query Central:

- Mexico and the Canadian provinces are now available on the QC home page "quick search" for CDL queries.
- The query type for driver queries now defaults correctly, according to user preferences.

Violation updates for CAPRI, CaseRite, and UFA were released and are available for download from the Information Systems Web site (<http://infosys.fmcsa.dot.gov/>). In addition, the CAPRI CSA 2010 update for Phase II of the Operational Model test is now available.
